# Play Kitty Kash and Support the SPCA

The Miramichi SPCA is a registered charity that is a private and independently run not-for-profit organization that has been in operation for over 16 years. It is a common and damaging misconception that our SPCA receives government or municipal funding; we are primarily supported by local in-person and online fundraisers, donations from the community, and special events.

#### Why We Need Support

Our volunteer board of 8 members, all with full-time jobs, is deeply passionate about animal welfare. Although our shelter has the potential to make a big impact for lost and abandoned animals, we need funds to continue this work.

The shelter only has 3 full-time and 4 part-time staff members to keep things running 7 days a week, and we are

currently running at maximum capacity with over 60 cats inhouse and many others out in foster care. Our waitlist for surrenders grows by the day.

The average monthly expenses for our shelter have increased by 30% in the last 2 years and currently sit at almost \$25,000. The cost of everything continues to increase and we are struggling each month to make sure the bills are paid and animals are cared for. We have a "wish list" of upgrades and items we would like to see at our shelter, but we cannot afford to do them. Fundraising takes a lot of manpower and volunteer hours and we do our best with the small team we have, but are so grateful when our community rallies on our behalf to help keep money coming in!

# MHL Releases 2024-25 Regular Season Schedule

The Maritime Junior Hockey League (MHL) has released the schedule for the 2024-25 regular season. The league's twelve teams will play a 52-game, balanced schedule. Teams will play eight games against each of their divisional opponents and two games against each of the teams in the opposite division. The top four teams in each division will qualify for the Metalfab MHL Cup Playoffs.

The regular season gets underway on Friday, September 13th with four games. The defending Metalfab MHL Cup champion Miramichi Timberwolves open their season on the road against the Grand Falls Rapids, the Truro Bearcats visit the West Kent Steamers, the Pictou County Weeks Crushers are on the road against the Yarmouth Mariners, and the Campbellton Tigers visit the Edmundston Blizzard.

In a rematch of the Metalfab MHL Cup Final, the Summerside Western Capitals host Miramichi on

#### **NB Aviation Museum Celebrates**

# 100th Anniversary

### of the Royal Canadian Air Force

The New Brunswick Aviation Museum will host an event on September 14 to celebrate the 100th anniversary of the Royal Canadian Air Force (RCAF), the 75th anniversary of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO), and the 75th anniversary of the reopening of RCAF Station/CFB Chatham including the stand up of 421 (F) Squadron, the second Canadian Fighter Squadron to be reinstated following the Second World War.

Come and explore Chatham's important role in the history of the RCAF, as a primary training and support facility, from the Second World War until the 1990s, and New Brunswick's important role in NATO and the Cold War.

Discover our amazing collection of aviation artifacts and try out our flight simulators. The New Brunswick Aviation Museum is located in Hangar 6 right next to the Miramichi airport main terminal. This interim Museum is our base of operations, providing a secure home and exhibition space for our artifact collection, and for our growing fleet of museum aircraft.

The Museum celebrates New Brunswick men and women who have made a significant contribution to military and/or civilian aviation history, at home and abroad. Through our exhibits, programs and activities, the Museum tells the stories of New Brunswick's aviation pioneers and heroes, mentors and role models, from cities, towns and communities all across the province.

The Museum also offers leading edge aviation and aerospace educational programs and activities. In

partnership with the Anglophone North School District, we focus on STEM goals and outcomes through formal classroom programs, outreach and home school offerings. We are a resource for flight training across the province, and we offer immersive aviation-themed educational programs and activities for provincial Air Cadet Squadrons and for students from ASD North and neighbouring school districts.

Visit our event tent and enjoy the afternoon's activities that include book signings and a presentation on the history of Chatham, an aviation activity school project, and a dessert theatre with an RCAF/NATO theme.

Our museum aircraft, as well as visiting aircraft and a helicopter, will be on display, and our pilot (Larry) will fly our First World War replica Nieuport XI.

At the Amateur Radio Display you can learn about Morse Code and key in your name to obtain a certificate, and have a chat with museum staff and volunteers, veterans and aircrew members from the visiting aircraft.

Students and Air Cadets will be there to act as guides and to answer any questions that you might have. Refreshments will be available.



## Peanut Butter Cookie Banana Pudding

#### Quick Delicious Dessert - Perfect for Sharing

As summer wraps up and you're getting ready for backto-school, here is a quick delicious dessert that doesn't call for wasting sunny days in the kitchen. Single-serve solutions are perfect for sharing with guests, whether you're hosting a family barbecue or birthday sleepover.

This Peanut Butter Cookie Banana Pudding can be prepped first thing in the morning and refrigerated until it's time for a treat. Portioned in 1/4-pint canning jars (or small, kid-proof cups to avoid a mess) for individual servings, you can simply break them out when the dessert bell dings and top them with whipped topping and extra cookies.

#### **Peanut Butter Cookie Banana Pudding**

Recipe courtesy of Peanut Butter Lovers on behalf of the Georgia **Peanut Commission** 

- 1 box (153g) instant vanilla pudding mix
- 3 cups cold milk
- 1 package peanut butter sandwich cookies
- 12 canning jars (1/4 pint each) or small dishes
- 2-3 bananas

frozen whipped topping, thawed as per package instructions

In large bowl, whisk pudding mix and milk until thoroughly combined. Set aside to soft set, about 5 minutes.

Cut or break six cookies in half and set aside. Pour the remainder of package in a large zip lock bag, seal it and use rolling pin to crush cookies.

Spoon a layer of cookie crumbs in bottom of each jar, reserving some for topping. Top with layer of vanilla



pudding. Cut one banana in half lengthwise and slice. Put a layer of bananas on top of pudding. Top bananas with another layer of pudding. Repeat with remaining ingredients.

Refrigerate until ready to serve. To serve, top with whipped topping and sprinkle with crushed cookies. Serve each with broken cookie half.

*Note:* Twelve 1/4-pint canning jars fit into disposable foil lasagna pan with clear lid for easy refrigeration and transportation.

#### Project LifeSaver Launches September 16

Does your loved one wander or have a tendency to bolt from the effects of Alzheimer's Disease, Autism, Down Syndrome, Traumatic Brain Injury or other cognitive challenges? All these conditions can push a person to wander and wandering and bolting is a reality that caregivers must face.

A missing person with a cognitive impairment, represents a critical emergency. They may be unaware of their situation, may not call out for help and may not respond to others who call out to them.

#### Project Lifesaver's technology can help:

- Decrease the chances of fatalities and injuries to a loved one.
- Significantly reduce the time needed to search for a missing wandering person.
- Provide families with a peace of mind.

This program is available to individuals who live with a cognitive challenge who may wander and are continually under care and supervision by a responsible family member or caregiver.



With Project Lifesaver, a transmitter bracelet is worn by an individual who is at a higher risk of wandering and becoming lost.

Clients who are a part of the Project LifeSaver program wear a one-ounce battery operated radio frequency transmitter that emits a unique signal every second, 24 hours a day. The battery provides a continuous signal for up to 45 days; however, it must be changed every 30 days. Should a loved one go missing, caregivers are instructed to immediately call 911.

Miramichi Ground Search & Rescue members are already trained in traditional search and rescue techniques, incorporate their training skills with the Project LifeSaver radio frequency tracking equipment to quickly locate a missing person.

MGSAR responders search using directional radio frequency receivers. Project LifeSaver requires a minimum of two searchers and recovery has been an average of under 30 minutes.

This proven technology has the capability of penetrating through obstacles such as concrete walls and thick forest to locate the battery powered, water resistant radio frequency transmitters emitting a signal that is tracked on the ground over several kilometers.

#### Where is Project LifeSaver available?

Volunteers from Miramichi Ground Search and Rescue have undergone specialized training to be able to respond in the event that a Project LifeSaver client wanders or bolts from care in the greater Miramichi area.



After winning his heat and feature at the Fog City Auto Spa 150, the 23year-old competitor hailing from Miramichi, found himself atop the point standings since May - that is, until the conclusion of the Chapman Bros. 150 presented by Hynes Paving earlier this month. Tucker watched his points lead evaporate from the fourth position as Cory Hall (#83) captured the win to steal the top spot heading into the season finale, the ReCar 150 presented by Wonder Auto & Tire.

"Honestly, we were pretty happy with our results leaving Oyster Bed Speedway," Tucker said. "Obviously, we didn't like to lose the points lead, but we struggled all day. To salvage a fourth-place finish and keep Cory close heading back to Speedway 660 was a win to us, all things considered. We just need to do exactly what we did last time at 660 and we'll be in good shape."

The last trip to Speedway 660 was for the Castle Building Centres 150 presented by Taiga Building Products, and that was certainly a memorable day. Tucker joined Hall and Ryan Messer (#1) at the back of the starting grid for the race, and methodically picked his way to the front, passing every car and taking the lead with 46 laps to go en

"It will be nice to not have to start at the back this time," Tucker said. "Cory being the most recent winner will be starting pretty deep, so hopefully we can capitalize on heat races and stay ahead of him for 150 laps."

Tucker - who works at the local Sheriff's department by day - has blossomed into an elite caliber driver and fan favorite in the region. Ranked as the third best Super Late Model 2020, Tucker has continued to achieve greater success with every season. With a knack for saving his equipment and tires until the closing laps of the race, Tucker has pulled off many wins in seemingly unlikely scenarios.

Tucker started his racing career in Bandoleros in 2012 - making a few starts before jumping in full-time in 2013. He would score his first feature win at Speedway 660 en route to



earning Rookie of the Year honors during that initial campaign. Quickly a dominant force, Tucker captured two championships in the same season, picking up the Bandolero championships at Speedway 660 and Petty International Raceway in 2015. That year, at 14 years old, Tucker would make his debut in the Super Late Model division during Speedway 660's Yard Gear 250, surviving a wild race to post a 12th place result.

Moving into a full commitment to the Super Late Model ranks, Tucker ran the Re/Max East Coast Elite Realty Pro Stock division full-time at Speedway 660 in 2016 - earning his first podium and Rookie of the Year honours during the season finale. That momentum translated into a monumental 2017 season that truly vaulted the then-teenager to star status - two Speedway 660 wins, podium finishes in the Yard Gear 250 and the Best of the Best 150, and posting a runner-up result in points.

However, everything changed over that off-season with the sudden passing of Ashton's father. Determined to persevere and continue, the then-17-year-old continued to compete weekly at Speedway 660 - but it would be during that summer when Tucker would first become aligned with Brad Silliker Motorsports. On the surface it was a match made in heaven - but it was a relationship that was tested early and often, with DNQ's, DNF's and engine failures plaguing their initial runs.

In 2019, Tucker and the Brad Silliker Motorsports team finally broke through to victory lane, conquering the Yard Gear 250 for the first time, and etching the beginning of a dynasty. Since then, Tucker has gone on to capture eighteen (18) feature wins - including three (3) Yard Gear 250's, the 2022 Summer Clash 250, the 2023 Mike Stevens Memorial, and four (4) Easy-Kleen Super Late Model Series wins.

Tucker and team also have a championship to their credit - earning the 2020 four-race points series held between Petty International Raceway and Speedway 660 during the COVID season. But this is different - this is for the Easy-Kleen Super Late Model Series title and the stakes are high.

"This has been a major goal since the series was announced to be in this position," Tucker said. "We started 2023 rough with a broken foot and car issues which really set us back, but we found our groove by the end of the season and knew we had a good piece for this year."

"It's been a lot of fun battling with Cory every week - I got to thank him for the respect he's shown all season. I hope to see the same respect going both ways racing for the championship - but stakes are high and I think we both acknowledge we both want to win and leave it all on the line and give the fans a great show."

Much like Hall, Tucker did not overlook the possibility of third place in points upsetting the dynamic duo. Robbie MacEwen (#40) has kept it a three-horse race all season, and enters twenty-two (22) points behind Hall and nineteen (19) behind Tucker. While it would take some circumstances to get MacEwen to overcome his deficit, anything can happen on the track.

"Robbie has had a great season too. He's a great driver with a strong car and strong team, and he's raced everyone with a lot of respect," Ashton commented. "I think for Cory and I, Robbie having a bit of a shot to take it from us forces us to race with a bit of restraint so that we both don't end up losing it."

When asked about what message he'd like to share with his competitors, Tucker made note of one that got away last year in the ReCar 150 presented by Wonder Auto & Tire.

"We come to win every week, and this is no different. We feel the ReCar 150 owes us one, and we're going to go get it."

The ReCar 150 presented by Wonder Auto & Tire on Saturday August 17th at Speedway 660 will be round six of six on the 2024 Easy-Kleen Super Late Model Series calendar. Action will get underway at 4pm with heat races for the Easy-Kleen Super Late Model Series.











